INVITATION

Summerland Yacht Club (SYC) is pleased to host the annual Giants Head Regatta. All activities will be concentrated around the SYC clubhouse and marina, including social events over the weekend. SYC invites all skippers, their crews, supporters and sponsors to enjoy the festivities.

RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the *Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS) (2025-2028), the prescriptions of Sail Canada, this Notice of Race, the Sailing Instructions (SI's) for this event.

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 Sailing Instructions will be posted to the official online at <https://summerlandyachtclub.com/syc-ghr-2025/> on or before July 15, 2025.
- 2.2 PHRF-BC Rules apply to handicap racing fleets, available online at <https://bcsailing.bc.ca/>.

COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 NoR and SI updates will be posted to the official notice board located online on Summerland Yacht Clubs website: <https://summerlandyachtclub.com/syc-ghr-2025/>

- 3.2 [Discretionary Penalty - DP] All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on channel 72.
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee will attempt to make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio, channel 72.
- 3.4 [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication unless that information is available to all boats. This restriction also includes mobile phones.

ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 4.1 The event is open to all keel boats with a valid 2025 PHRF certificate.
- 4.2 Any boat not holding a valid PHRF certificate will be issued a rating by the Organizing Authority.
- 4.3 The PHRF-BC rating system with time-on-time calculations apply.
- 4.4 Fleets: The Race Committee will decide fleet divisions after the number and type of entrants is determined. A minimum of five Santana 525 boats registered to race shall constitute a separate one-design fleet. Boats racing in the one-design fleet shall comply with class rules.
- 4.5 Where fewer than five Santana 525's are registered for the overall series, the PHRF-BC rating system will apply, and boats will be assigned to a fleet subject to rating.
- 4.6 Registration will be available online and a link to the registration page will be posted on Summerland Yacht Club webpage here: <https://summerlandyachtclub.com/syc-ghr-2025/> starting June 1, 2025 and ending August 4, 2025 at 10:30 PDT.
- 4.7 Provisional Classes are defined as follows:

Fleet A	PHRF	< 153
Fleet B	PHRF	> =153
Fleet C (S525)	Class Rules	One Design Racing

*Minimum five entries required to constitute a one-design fleet.

5.3 Refunds and/or cancellations will be accepted up to 17:00 PDT on July 31, 2025. Please note, all refunds and/or cancellations will be subject to a \$25.00 administration fee. Any refunds/or cancellations processed after this date will be subject to a 100% charge of the overall fee.

5.4 Prices stated above are subject to the appropriate taxes, fees and gratuities.

SCHEDULE

6.1 Registration & Check-In: Friday, August 8 from 17:00 – 19:00 PDT at Summerland Yacht Club Patio.

6.2 Racing:

6.2.1 Competitors' meeting will be at 08:30 PDT on Saturday, August 9, 2025.

6.2.2 Scheduled time for the first warning signal on Saturday, August 9, 2025 is 9:30 PDT with race to Rattlesnake Island completed or by abandoned by 16:00 PDT.

6.2.3 Scheduled time for the first warning signal on Sunday, August 10, 2025 is 09:30 PDT with no race starting later than 13:30 PDT.

6.3 Social Events:

6.3.1 A detailed schedule of events will be circulated closer to the date of the event.

COURSES

- 7.1 The courses to be sailed will be on Okanagan Lake in the vicinity of Summerland Yacht Club. Saturday will be a race to Rattlesnake Island from SYC and returning to SYC. Sunday's racing will be around buoys. A detailed description will be provided in the Sailing Instructions.

SCORING

- 8.1 Each Fleet will be scored separately.
- 8.2 Scoring will be calculated using Time on Time.
- 8.3 One (1) race is needed to constitute a series.
- 8.4 The Low Point scoring system of Appendix A of the Racing Rules of Sailing will apply.
- 8.5 One (1) race is required to be completed to constitute a regatta.
- 8.6 For all classes:
- 8.6.1 When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of their race scores.
- 8.6.2 When from five (5) to seven (7) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of their race scores excluding their worst score.
- 8.6.3 When eight (8) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of their race scores excluding their two worst scores.

PRIZES

- 9.1 Prizes will be awarded in each fleet.
- 9.2 A first overall prize will be awarded by calculating the lowest point score as follows:
- Total of Low Point Scoring System received by the boat for all races in its series, divided by the number of races of its class, divided by the number of boats in its class. Discards are in accordance with the Regatta's Sailing Instructions.

SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 10.1 All Transport Canada Safety Regulations as they apply.

- 10.2 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee at the first reasonable opportunity.
- 10.3 A boat may be requested to assist another vessel as directed by the Race Officer of the Day.

EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

- 11.1 A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules, Notice of Race, and Sailing Instructions.
- 11.2 [DP] When instructed by a race official on the water, a boat shall proceed to a designated area for inspection.

RISK STATEMENT

- 12.1 RRS 3 states “*The responsibility for a boat’s decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.*” By participating in this event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. The risks include but are not limited to strong winds, rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform, and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. **Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.**

INSURANCE

- 13.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$2,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.

MOORAGE & CLUB ACCESS

- 14.1 If temporary moorage is required at Summerland Yacht Club, please complete the Reciprocal Moorage Request Form at:

- 14.2 Access to the Summerland Yacht Club and marina will be kept open for the event.

ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

- 15.1 All regatta participants are requested to adhere to the Summerland Yacht Club Environmental Policy including: eliminating the release of contaminants to the water column, both directly and indirectly, minimize the release of pollutants to the atmosphere, avoid contamination of the ground, adopt waste reduction, reuse and recycling strategies, optimize energy and water conservation, promote good environmental practices to all parties, abide by, and, where possible, exceed the requirements of all relevant legislation.
